

## **Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update August 2024**

#### Crime

There were fifty one reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for July. For Humberston these included:

Residential Burglary:

Between 24<sup>th</sup> May and 1<sup>st</sup> July, a burglary occurred at a chalet on Humberston Fitties. The intruder lit a fire, consumed alcohol, and stole items from the property.

Overnight 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> July, another chalet on Humberston Fitties was broken into after the rear door was kicked in. Electrical items were stolen.

Criminal damage:

Eggs were thrown at a property on Humberston Avenue.

Graffiti was sprayed on the front garden fence of a property on Humberston Avenue.

In connection with the other graffiti, a wheelie bin at a neighbouring property on Humberston Avenue was also sprayed.

Damage to the outer pane of a patio door window on Coniston Crescent. A house window was smashed by a

brick on St Christophers Road.




## **Summer Clubs**

## **Greetings from St Peter's Church**


We hope you are all enjoying the lovely summer weather. It is perfect weather for a good harvest with the rain and the sunshine. Our next main festival is the Harvest Festival.



## <u>Travel around Humberston for just £1 to get wherever</u> you want in North East Lincolnshire

There are a whole range of ways to get around town, but none as cheap or readily available as the bus.

In Humberston, residents can access a number of services such as the 8, 9 and 10 to get them to where they need to go. What's even better though is the price it costs you to use them.

Number 8 – this service operates from Cleethorpes Pier to Grimsby Town Centre via Humberston, Scartho and Westward Ho and runs every 30 minutes.

Number 9 & 10 - this service operates from Tesco Hewitts Circus, to Waltham via North Sea Lane, Kingsway, Cleethorpes Pier, Grimsby Road, GY Town Centre, Bargate, Scartho Road, terminating on Barnoldby Road. Both services run every 30 minutes.

For just £1 after 6pm on weekdays and all day on weekends and bank holidays, you can get wherever you need to go across the borough. Whether you're travelling to a doctor's appointment or taking a trip into town, getting the bus is the easiest and cheapest way to do it.

Alternatively, you can download the Stagecoach app to find out everything you need to know about the buses in your area.

For less than the cost of an ice cream or a coffee, get yourself out and about and relax on one of the many buses travelling through Humberston.

As well as this, for those who are eligible, you can travel for free throughout North East Lincolnshire. If you have a disability or get a state pension, you can apply for a concessionary travel pass.

Recently, this service has been enhanced to allow pass holders to travel for free before 9.30am for on top of what was already available. Now getting to those early appointments can be a simple trip on the bus and one that won't cost you a penny either!

As we look to improve accessibility for buses in the area, we are also moving forward with additional double yellow lines along Humberston Avenue near to the Tetney Road end.

This is to help reduce issues for buses during peak times, such as school drop-offs and pick-ups. With the addition of the yellow lines, it will prevent cars from parking in areas where buses would usually stop, enhancing the punctuality of the service.

Note that the Village Council has some large paper copies of the maps in the Parish Office at Wendover Queen Elizabeth Hall. There is someone in the office on Thursday afternoons beteeen 2 and 4 pm if you want to drop in and collect one.
