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Highways

Nobody enjoys delays caused by roadworks. Humberston and in fact all of North East Lincolnshire have suffered delays because of recent roadworks. Despite meticulous planning, delays are inevitable with temporary traffic lights. A lot of the works are by utility companies who have a right to work on or near the highways. Ward Councillors do our very best to minimise the delays and, if possible, work with partners to phase the work and to improve the locations of the traffic lights etc. within Humberston when they occur.

In Grimsby engineering works to 100-year-old Grade 11 listed structure, Corporation Road Bridge has resulted in a prolonged closure due to condition of the structure. The A180 Bridges essential repair scheme is underway, with work currently ongoing to the Gilbey Road Bridge and Cleethorpes Road bridge. I am pleased to announce the contractor did organise drop in events, "Cuppa with the Contractors". This was an opportunity to understand the urgency of the bridge repairs that have been required and the complexity of the work.

Devolution

Proposals for a devolution deal for Greater Lincolnshire have been approved by North East Lincolnshire, Lincolnshire and North Lincolnshire Councils.

The proposals, which would secure new investment of at least £720m into Greater Lincolnshire over the next 30 years, were approved by North East Lincolnshire Council's Cabinet before being discussed and voted for at a meeting of the full Council.

Last year, an agreement was made between government and the three Lincolnshire lead authorities – Lincolnshire County Council, and North East Lincolnshire and North Lincolnshire unitary authorities – for extra powers and funding to be transferred from Westminster.

Finally, your Ward Councillors are always available to respond to your issues.

Hopefully our hard work has been rewarded.

Planning

DM/1098/22/OUT Land south of Millenium Farm – Outline application to erect up to 80 dwellings to include public open space with green infrastructure and SUD's features, local area for play, landscaping and biodiversity enhancements with means of access to be considered – Refused by the NELC Planning Committee. Status Appeal in Progress Ref. No: AP/020/23.

DM/0696/19FUL Land East of Midfield Road, Humberston, North East Lincolnshire. Erection of 225 dwellings with access off Midfield Road and Andrew Road with ancillary parking, garaging and associated infrastructure and widening of Andrew Road. Status: Appeal dismissed.

DM/0068/22/OUT Land South of Church Lane, Humberston, North East Lincolnshire. Outline application to erect 93 dwellings with means of access to be considered (amended plans to include construction access off South Sea Lane). Status: Appeal dismissed.

DM/0568/23/OUT Land to The South of Church Lane, Humberston Outline application with only means of access to be considered, (but not within the site) for the development of up to 26 dwellings and associated landscaping and infrastructure with access from Church Lane - Habitat Regulations Assessment October 2023 (additional information for HRA December 2023). Status: Pending Consideration.

Highways/Footpaths/Traffic Issues

Quarterly meeting held in May with NELC and ongoing items being actioned and Village walk around will be organised with NELC going forward.

Planning

The Village Council continues to receive consultation on many planning applications for Humberston and these are discussed at the Village Council main monthly meetings and also at an interim Planning Committee Meeting held mid-way through the month.

Residents are most welcome to attend and make the Village Council aware of any issues with planning. All Planning Agendas and Minutes are all on the Village Council website. The minutes show the Village Council's observations and comments on each application it considered.

Wendover Paddock and Halls

The Halls continue to be very busy and we have some new hirings with us as well as some of our regular hirings taking increased sessions.

The Council is having acoustic boards fitted now in the Queen Elizabeth Hall to help improve the sound quality, especially at meetings etc. The Council is also looking into the possibility of solar panels to offset its energy costs and both of these schemes are ongoing.

The Council will also be providing a new piece of equipment within the Paddock this year and is just obtaining prices for doing so.

Finance

The Council is now in its audit period and has had its internal audit already completed and has now sent off all the necessary information to the external auditors. All information is available on our website at:

Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update May 2024

Crime

There were fifty eight reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for April. For Humberston these included:

Residential Burglary:

During the morning of 26th April, a caravan parked in the grounds of a property on Tetney Road was broken into. The caravan was searched, and possessions thrown outside.

Commercial Burglary:

During the early hours of 20th April, a male was seen to enter numbers into a keypad trying to access a premises on Humberston Avenue. He made off after being disturbed.

During the evening of 29th April, two males attempted to enter the Gingerbread House Tea Rooms on Church Lane. They tried door handles and climbed on a wheelie bin to access windows. They left the area after being disturbed.

Criminal damage:

Damage caused to a static caravan fixtures and fittings by an occupant

Other crime include:

Eleven assaults.

Five shop thefts, four from Tesco, one from Spar.

Three reports of harassment.

One minor public order offence.

There have been five reports of ASB.

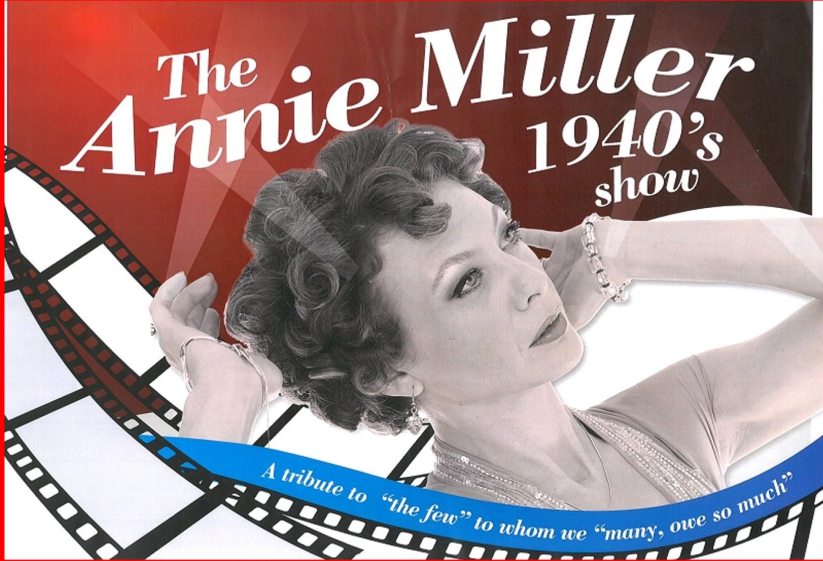

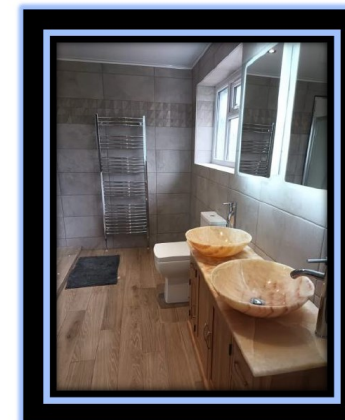
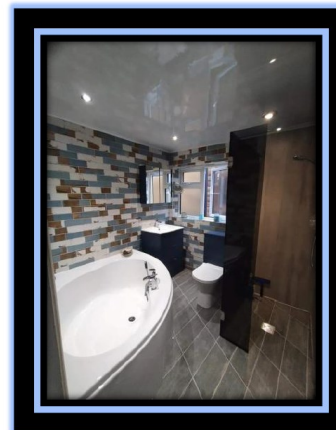

CEMETERY NEWS

The Village Council has now had its planning permission for the new cemetery extension granted and has also now completed the purchase of the land from NELC.

The land is adjacent to the current cemetery and the plans will allow access from the current cemetery through to the new part, but there will not be a separate gated entrance to the front—the access will only be from the existing cemetery.

Works are now underway to put in the infrastructure with landscaping taking place which has prepared and seeded the site and then fencing will go up around the perimeter with a hedge planted. Once the hedge is established then the fencing will eventually be removed.

The plans will also incorporate a large structure at the centre with seating which will form the basis of a memorial garden where memorial plaques will be able to be purchased to remember loved ones who are not actually interred within the Cemetery. Further details on this will follow later in the year when we have finished most of our infrastructure.

Works will be ongoing through the Summer and into the Autumn and as soon as it is appropriate to do so, the new part of the Cemetery will be brought into service.
