Hello everybody, as we approach the season of goodwill, this year it will be especially difficult to experience the joy of the season. Many of our older residents have lost their winter fuel payments, a cruel and thoughtless measure by the new Labour government. It is especially hard as you will all be facing large increase in your fuel bills following the cap changes in October. In my own case, my monthly bill has increased by over 35%.

Given this sad state of affairs it is especially important that you all claim the support that is available to you, especially pension credit and single person discount on your council tax if you live alone and the council tax reduction scheme (this is means tested). Many of you will find it challenging to complete the forms to make these claims, but you can get help from:-

Humberston & New Waltham Ward Update November 2024

Crime

There were fifty five reported crimes across the Humberston & New Waltham Ward for October to date. For Humberston these included:

Residential Burglary

Between 30th September and 2nd October, a home on Church Lane was broken into after forcing the patio door lock. Cash, jewellery, and other items were stolen. Two males have been arrested in connection with this offence. On 5th October, a burglary occurred at a property on Brooklyn Drive when a rear door to the property was forced. Although searched, it appears nothing was stolen. On 21st October, an attempt burglary took place at a home on Lingard

Road, where a person is seen to be trying the door handle. The person then tries the door handle of the family car parked on the drive.

Commercial Burglary

Overnight 16th & 17th September, the workshop at Tetney Road Service Station was broken in to and cash stolen.

Vehicle Crime:

Overnight 16th & 17th October, a car parked on St Johns Road was entered after a window was smashed. Nothing was stolen.

Criminal Damage:

Car windows and a garden fence were damaged on Burcom Avenue. Damage to a van windscreen which had been parked overnight on the car park of the Countryman Pub.

Damage to a patio door pane after an object was fired at it causing a hole.

One domestic related damage.



It is anticipated that the new extension may be able to be put into use in the new year at the beginning of 2025 but as with most things, it is weather dependent on completion for works.

• Remember that genuine callers won't mind checks. If you feel at all unsure, schedule a time for the caller to come back when a friend or relative is there?

For pre-planned appointments with utility companies, a password scheme can be set up.

2 - Residential Burglaries (break into your property to steal items)

There are a couple of things that we could consider when highlighting crime prevention, namely.

• If you are going away, consider having automatic plugin time switch to operate a lamp or light at pre-set times when you're away.

• Consider requesting a trusted relative/neighbour to look after your address whilst away.

- Consider having external lighting.
- Consider having a house alarm.
- Consider purchasing CCTV or ring doorbell.
- If you have gates or fences, please consider closing and locking them.

The team and I have conducted several foot patrols including plain clothes operations and was surprised to see the amount of insecurities within the neighbourhood. **Make your property looked lived in, even when you go out!**

The plea from your local Neighbourhood team, is look out for each other – check in on your neighbours and family. If you see or hear anything suspicious, can you please report it on 999 (in an emergency), 101 (non-emergency) or on-line.

Dear Residents,

I appreciate that not everybody is registered on my community alert, or even have access to internet. That is why, I am grateful to the Parish Council for inviting me to write a message to you in relation to Burglaries. Your neighbourhood has recently been targeted for several burglaries and your local Police Team are doing all they can to prevent these from happening.

Burglary is an impactive crime on the victim, and only by working together and looking out for each other would we be able to prevent our properties from becoming a target.

There are two types of burglaries:

1 - **Distraction burglary (**Distraction burglars pretend to be someone they are not in order to gain entry to your home)

Common methods used by distraction burglars:

- Pretending to be from a care agency, the council or a utility company investigating a gas or water leak.
- Seeking help to leave a note for a neighbour or even asking for a drink of water if they claim to be thirsty or unwell.
- Claiming to be in a hurry or emergency and needing to get into your home quickly.
 - Working in teams, with one person distracting you while the other searches your home.

There are several things you can do to prevent distraction burglary. Always remember "if in doubt, keep them out":

- Use your door viewer to see who's there.
- If you open the door, put the chain on first.
- Always ask for ID and check it with the company before letting somebody into your home.

• Use the phone number advertised in the phone book or online, as the number on their identity card could be fake. For a utility company, call the customer service department. Close the door while you do this.




Well done to Lyn Doll, a Humberston resident, on her award as Best Neighbour for her work in her local Neighbourhood Watch Scheme.
